

NORTHERN INDIA

"We were seconds away from leaving having just finished our first game drive and to all intents and purposes had 'logged out' of Ranthambhore Tiger Sanctuary. The route we'd been on had been OK, we'd seen lots of deer (and would tell a bemused enquiring German tourist all about then after breakfast) but hadn't encountered anything else of particular note. This was soon to change as the forest guard taking down our details informed our guide that everyone on another route had been graced with outstanding views of a magnificent male Tiger! Money changed hands and we were miraculously granted access to this alternative route. Our driver, clearly now in Schumacher mode and auditioning for a place in the *Force India* formula one team, was a new man and five minutes and several kilometres later we were all gawping and snapping images of our quarry – a truly outstanding creature. Just a reminder this was our FIRST game drive – never before have we been so lucky and bagged our primary quarry at the very first attempt. What a relief and all the more pleasurable since the previous day's train from Delhi down to Ranthambhore had been sufficiently late to have prevented us from entering the sanctuary that afternoon. The entire outlook of this first portion of the tour would change now we'd seen Tiger – we'd spend more time birding and less time sitting, listening and chasing after alarm calling deer! Outstanding and we were all grateful to Rajveer for acting so promptly and handing over the money!

Other goodies at Ranthambhore included a teasing party of Jungle Bush Quail, one Yellow-crowned and eventually also one White-naped Woodpecker, some spectacular Great Thick-knees, Indian Vultures over the magnificent fort, a solitary Little Heron that welcomed us in to the park and watched us leave, some close-range Black Storks and a pair of Common Iora in the same hotel garden trees where there had seen a pair of Marshall's the previous year. Not quite as close to our rooms as the Ioras were umpteen vociferous Rufous-fronted Prinias, several extremely approachable Ashy-crowned Sparrow and even a pair of Rufous-tailed Larks. Best of all however were the party of no less than 15 Indian Coursers in the field right behind the hotel and the nightly Painted Sandgrouse drinking-pool spectacle. These exquisitely plumaged creatures even came eighth in the end of tour 'Bird of the Trip poll' – a remarkable feat for something only seen early on in the tour. Our first wheatear, Variable, was watched just outside the hotel compound but was joined by umpteen Isabelline and Desert Wheatears during our excursion to Soorwal Dam. That same 'trip out in to the desert' provided a fascinating insight in to Rajasthan village life as well as decent looks at up to 25 Dalmatian Pelicans, an incredibly confiding Eurasian Wryneck, an ever elusive Eurasian Thick-knee, several Yellow-wattled Lapwings and Rosy Starlings while one Streak-throated and a few Wire-tailed Swallows watched us 'enjoying' our picnic lunch cheese sandwiches. And then there were the greedy, no extraordinarily greedy, hand fed Rufous Treepies, the Jungle Babblers and the slightly less appealing palm squirrels but few of us would claim that we saw anything that came close to competing with our Tiger.

Bharatpur, our next port of call, has been suffering badly due to a series of poor monsoons and despite summer 2010 bringing lots of monsoon rain (we were to witness some of its ravages during our time at Corbett) and there was still way too little water in the reserve. Nevertheless we still found many of the area's premier attractions. Rajveer first took us to several sites, several times on the edge of Bharatpur town that he knew for Greater Painted-snipe but we failed to find them and had to wait until the very last day of the tour before catching up with this gorgeous creature. Real highlights in this world-renown park included a day-time roosting Large-tailed Nightjar, a crow-harassed Dusky Eagle-owl close its nest, a magnificent pair of Sarus Cranes, two Imperial Eagles, some ridiculously cute Yellow-eyed Babblers and even a Brooks's Leaf Warbler or two.

Leaving Bharatpur we made a day trip to Bund Baretha, a reservoir that still held lots of water, and lots of birds. We'd no sooner arrived than a Brown Crake gave us the necessary run-around before eventually performing well. Other goodies at BB included another, and this time even fairly cooperative, party of Jungle Bush Quail as well as decent numbers of diving ducks.

Our next port of call was Agra and the Taj Mahal, where we had a fabulous guided tour around the marble mausoleum before spending a short while shopping...

The Chambal Safari Lodge, a site that boasted the likes of Brown Hawk Owl right inside its compound, was next and the site's premier attraction, a boat ride on the now mighty Chambal River, was great fun. Gorgeous scenery, great weather, a scattering of raptors that included a Bonelli's Eagle near its nest and water birds galore – what more could we have asked for? Our best water birds included good numbers of close-range Indian Skimmers, numerous Black-bellied Terns and several Pallas's Gulls add to these we also had excellent looks at two species of crocodile (including some truly impressive Gharial) and several Gangetic Dolphins. A fabulous boat ride.

The next day was largely a travelling day - back through Agra and on back up to Delhi where we had two rooms and time for dinner in a thief's restaurant, before catching an over night sleeper train on up to the base of the Himalayas. Once there we met our enthusiastic jeep drivers and headed off to breakfast. Not quite *the best porridge on the planet* ensued but what we were fed fortified us none-the-less and we were soon on again. Our next port of call was Ramnagar but we made numerous stops even before we reached this bustling small town. One of our stops produced an impressive assemblage of woodpeckers with three flamebacks as well as our first Grey-capped Pygmy. These were followed by an elusive Oriental Pied Hornbill before we went on to score with our first Red Junglefowl, Kalij Pheasants, White-rumped Vultures and Steppe Eagles as well as the first of our two fly-by Wallcreepers. Unable to find the increasingly elusive Ibisbills we had to make do with fabulous looks at our first Collared Falconets while a talkative party of White-crested Laughingthrushes were close enough to our lodge to be effectively welcoming us to our new abode.

Early the following morning we added a pair of Great Hornbills as well as Fulvous-breasted Woodpecker, Brown Fish Owl, three Common Green Magpies, three Brown Dippers and Black-colored Tit to our rapidly expanding bird lists – and all before a fabulous breakfast with *the best porridge on the planet* on the hotel's lawn! As if the porridge wasn't enough we were also entertained by a cooperative pair of Crimson Sunbirds during the feast. We soon headed off again stopping after a short ride at one of our driver's sites where we were treated to some breathtaking looks at a Long-billed Thrush. Lunch wasn't much later but even this was interrupted by views of an unusually cooperative Chestnut-headed Tesia, while in the afternoon a brief sojourn back at the hotel yielded a pair of Orange-bellied Leafbirds while a party of Puff-throated Babblers heralded sunset and the end of a superb day's birding. For many of us The Den was our favourite site.

On our slow drive in to Corbett Park the following morning we were detained by an encounter with a wild Elephant and others with small numbers of White-rumped Needletails, an uncooperative Speckled Piculet, two species of yellownape, several adult Pallas's Fish Eagles and much, much more.

The afternoon's jeep drive was spent in and around the Dhikala grasslands and produced a solitary Rufous Woodpecker, Asian Barred Owlet, a fine male Pied Harrier, two more Collared Falconets, as well as both Changeable and Mountain Hawk-Eagles. Great fun though it was it was only a smaller taster of things to come.

Next day we found a Grey-backed Shrike right besides the compound and a Stork-billed Kingfisher a little further away while no less than four Streak-throated Woodpeckers, an incredibly obliging White-tailed Rubythroat and a Tawny Fish Owl at a site our mahoots (elephant drivers) showed us kept us enthralled. The highlight of our afternoon game drive – and for many of the entire tour – was a fabulous, close range encounter with a Tiger of our very own. Another magnificent male it stayed in view for the best part of five minutes!

Leaving Corbett Park the following day it was then time to head up in to the mountains around Nainital. Our birding on Snow View Ridge the following morning was at times frantic and produced our first Oriental Turtle Doves, Chestnut-bellied Rock Thrushes, some very cooperative Eurasian and Black-headed Jays, Grey-winged Blackbirds, umpteen White-tailed Nuthatches, a magnificent party of 60 White-throated Laughingthrushes and Rufous Sibias, but perhaps most bizarre were the 25 Greylag Goose that circled high over the town and the lake! We were even treated to a respectable look at some of the towering snow-capped Himalayan Peaks towards the Nepalese and Chinese borders off to the east. An excursion to Sattal took up the rest of the day and produced species such as Upland Pipit, Black Eagle, Green-tailed Sunbird, Spotted Forktail and a Collared Owlet that came in to check us out while the drive back came to a screeching halt as a Lammergeier was spotted high overhead.

Starting early the following morning we headed straight to our Cheer Pheasant stake out. Here welcomed by several Goral, we soon bagged the hoped for pheasant before going on to watch both Rufous-bellied and Himalayan Woodpeckers, Yellow-browed Tit, two Himalayan Red-flanked Bush-robins and our first Buff-barred Warbler while a brief stop in a village on the way back yielded a fantastic Chestnut Thrush as well as our best Yellow-breasted Greenfinch and Great Barbets of the entire tour.

All too soon it was time to leave Nainital and head back to the tumult that is Delhi. Arriving in the early hours we had a short excursion to a nearby wetland - Sultanpur jheel that produced impressive numbers of birds and even modest number of new species including eight Greater Painted-snipe, Pied Avocet and Indian Silverbill.

Last year I finished the tour report off with the following paragraph 'India's undeniably an assault to the senses, all the senses. There certainly is abject poverty and considerable filth and yet the country's full of happy, friendly people and is home to an enviable array of magnificent birds and mammals. Just how many of us left with fingers crossed that India's wildlife will continue to survive...there are increasing signs of dramatic declines in the numbers of Tigers present in the reserves and their future and indeed the future of the entire country is far from certain...' Things haven't changed much since I wrote that, not yet." – *Paul Holt*
